RAMAZ MARKS 1st GRADUATION SAMUEL LEVY WILL SPEAK AT EXERCISES

On Tuesday, June 15th, the Ramaz School will hold its first Graduation Exercises in the school auditorium at the C.J.I. Building. Five students who have completed their course of study at Ramaz will receive their diplomas on that occasion.

The commencement address will be delivered by Samuel Levy, Chairman of the Board of Directors of Yeshiva College, who will speak on "The Integration of Judaism and Americanism." Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein will preside at the Exercises.

One of the features of the commencement program will be the presentation of a musical cavalcade by the school chorus under the direction of Shalom Altman. Two valedictory addresses will be delivered, one in Hebrew by Arthur Rosenfeld and the other in English by Renee Margareten.

The following will receive their diplomas: Harold Berger, Gurston Goldin, Renee Margareten, Arthur Rosenfeld, and Matthew Zuckerman.

A cordial invitation is extended to all our congregants, to the Men's Club and Sisterhood to the Commencement Exercises which mark the first significant milestone in the young history of Ramaz.

MACHTENBERG CHOIR WILL FEAT- TURE FATHER'S DAY SERVICE S. J. LANCE TO DELIVER SERMON

May we suggest that you keep this issue for the special calendar of summer dates that it has and which you will find helpful for your guidance.

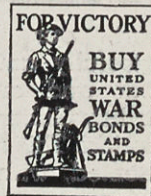
CONDOLENCES TO MRS. ZUCKERMAN
