It is not the result of a caprice nor is it intended to embarass anyone. Its purpose is to eliminate annoying distractions to the preacher and especially to the listeners. It is a practice incidentally that is followed in almost all modern houses of worship.

If an apology is in order it is to those who came shortly before 10:30 and were not admitted because the sermon began a few minutes before the scheduled time. That was due to the fact that it is impossible to time to the minute a long service like the cne on Rosh Hashanah.
