RABBI LOOKSTEIN WILL PREACH THIS SABBATH AT 10:30 A.M.

on

"THE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE — ITS RISE AND FALL"

The Rabbi's Sermon this Saturday

An incident of wide implication and far reaching consequences took place within the last fortnight when the American Jewish Committee seceded from the American Jewish Conference. The entire Jewish community was shaken to its very foundations by this action. Jewry of Palestine is stunned. Wherever Jews and non-Jews assemble this forms the major subject of discussion.

It is important to know the background of this action as well as the philosophies and ideologies that are responsible for it. Rabbi Lookstein, who was a delegate to the American Jewish Conference and has an inti-

mate knowledge of the entire subject, will discuss it this Saturday morning from the pulpit. The title of his address will be, "The American Jewish Committee — Its Rise and Fall."

Because of the importance of the subject and the additional time required for its treatment, the sermon will begin promptly at 10:45. All our congregants who are alert to the Jewish problem in our day and who are concerned with its solution are urged to be in the synagogue this Saturday. No intelligent Jew or Jewess can afford to be without a full knowledge of what is transpiring in Jewish life today.

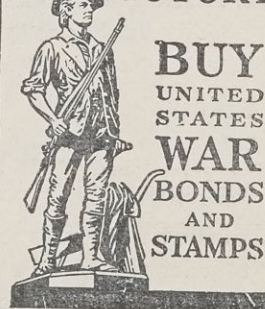
