## CRIME EXPERTS FASCINATE LARGE CROWD AT NOV. MEETING

Turkus spoke on "Crime and its Detection." Both men, by universal consent, spoke long past their allotted time. Dr. Gettler explained the unerring accuracy of modern scientific methods in aiding the solution of the most baffling crime. Several famous cases were cited. The dynamic Assistant District Attorney, Burion B. Turkus, told us how organized crime, which is established on a nation-wide scale, defies the law and thwarts the machinery of justice. His "inside story" of the methods of gangsterism and the difficulties of obtaining a conviction was as enthralling as it was ferrifying.

direction are bringing this about.
