He proved an ardent friend of Palestine and Zionism and knows the problem intimately, having traveled through that unhappy land many times and for long visits. We certainly have a better grasp of some of the problems of that turbulent part of the world because of his intelligent and informative talk.

Our Rabbi spoke of the audience he and his group had in Washington with Secretary Hull, on the abrogation of the White Paper and the establishment of a Palestine Commonwealth. We are sorry to report he gave us no great hope in either direction. However, we can all do one thing and that is write to our Congressman and Senators.

After the meeting we all gathered around the festive board to enjoy Sam Bucher's fetching frankfurters. Needless to say we once again had a capacity audience.

On March 21, our next meeting date, Leo Lania; the only Jew ever to receive an invitation from Hitler, will be the principal speaker. His subject will be "The European Underground."

BENEVOLENT FUND

To Leigh Robbins we give thanks for his generous donation to our Men's Club Benevolent Fund. This is not the first time this gentleman has contributed. He has recognized, as have so many others, the splendid and realistic work the Fund is doing.
