A Passover Message from Rabbi Lookstein

The opening paragraph of the Seder ritual contains the declaration, "This year we are slaves, next year we shall be free men". This is an affirmation of faith in the unconquerable spirit of man and in the ultimate power of God's deliverance.

In the spirit of such faith does the Jew prepare to celebrate his Passover festival. He is aware that millions of his brethren have been destroyed in the lands of bondage. He is aware, too, that hundreds of thousands more are in shackles in the occupied lands of Europe. Yet, he dares to hope, and seeks to infect the entire world with that hope.

Every holy congregation of Israel should this year re-dedicate itself during our festival of emancipation, to the tasks of freedom that must come and to the obligations of democracy to follow. Every Israelite, man, woman and child ought to come to the House of God and out of the ancient Holiday liturgy, draw renewed inspiration for the days that lie ahead. Every family ought to meet at the Seder table and recognize in every symbol the memories of the past and the hope for the future. To our fellow citizens of all faiths this is a Holiday season of prayer and penance. To the community of Israel, too, this festival of Passover is an occasion of holy consecration.

A happy Passover to you, dear brethren and to all your families. May emancipation soon come to all the world. And may peace and security be the portion of Israel and all humanity.

PASSOVER RELIEF FUND REACHES NEW HIGH

About \$1600 has already been obtained in response to our annual Passover Relief appeal. A number of our friends have as yet not responded. When they are heard from it will be possible to reach the \$2500 quota set for this year.

In the meantime we have already turned over \$1000 to the Yorkville Passover Relief Fund for distribution among the poor in our community. Contributions were also sent to Hias, Ezrath Tora and Vaad Hahatzala, the agencies that take care of the refugee rabbis and students in all parts of the world. A small subsidy was also allocated to the refugee rabbis in Palestine and a contribution of \$100 was sent to the Jewish Welfare Board for special Passover packages for our boys in the armed services.

We have listed these subsidies because we are anxious that those who have not made their contributions yet should realize how important it is for them to respond. All these agencies will receive additional allocations from us just as soon as additional funds arrive. Before you sit down at the Seder table make sure that you have done your duty by those in need.
