### IN THE EGYPT OF TODAY

The following is an address delivered by Rabbi Lookstein through the Office of War Information to the Jews of occupied Europe.

Brethren in the land of affliction! We speak to you from the United States of America, the land of freedom and democracy. We are addressing ourselves to you who are living in the different Egypts of our day. We know of your affliction. Frequently we have heard your cry of anguish. Always we were stirred by your dauntless courage. For the suffering that you have undergone and for the courage in the face of it, you will be rewarded.

This is to our people the season of freedom. We are preparing to celebrate the glorious festival of Passover. We recall again the Exodus from Egypt, the release from bondage and the emancipation from oppression and slavery. We know how difficult it is for you to observe Passover amidst the circumstances under which you live.

Draw renewed hope and courage for the days to come. The day of deliverance is not far off. Freedom cannot be suppressed, and emancipation cannot be long delayed. The brave legions of democracy are battling your enemies and will defeat them.

Our hearts and our thoughts are with you. As we, in the land of freedom, will sit around the Seder table, we will think of you and pray for you. As we dip our greens into salt water we will taste your tears. As we will look upon the red wine we will think of your innocent blood that was savagely shed. The pale matzoth will recall to us your miserably rationed bread of affliction. Every symbol of the Seder ritual will make us think of you and of your desperate plight. Throughout the Passover season our prayers will be directed to our Heavenly Father in your behalf. We shall recite with emphatic faith and confidence the ancient formula, "Next year we shall be free men". We shall pronounce with piety and assurance the affirmation, "That God will then speedily bring us forth from servitude to freedom, from sorrow to gladness, from darkness to great light and from slavery to redemption".

May you live to observe truly happy Passovers in a world of happiness and peace. Good Yomtov to you, our Brethren.
