DR. SAMUEL BELKIN TO BE INAUGURATED AS YESHIVA PRESIDENT

Dr. Samuel Belkin will be inaugurated as president of the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary and Yeshiva College amidst appropriate ceremonies on Tuesday afternoon, May 23 in the college auditorium. The guest of honor at the inauguration ceremonies will be Chief Justice Harlan F. Stone of the United States Supreme Court.

The occasion is of historic significance to American Israel. Dr. Belkin one of the foremost scholars of our generation, in succeeding the late Dr. Bernard Revel of blessed memory, is assuming the leadership of the greatest institution of higher Jewish learning on this continent and the first college of liberal arts and sciences under Jewish auspices. With the destruction of the ancient cities of Jewish learning in the Old World, Yeshiva and Yeshiva College are of special significance to universal Israel.

Mr. Max J. Etra, president of our congregation, is chairman of the Inaugural Committee that has made all of the arrangements. Mr. Samuel Levy, chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Yeshiva will preside at the ceremonies and Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, professor of Homiletics and Practical Rabbinics at the Yeshiva, will present the candidates for honorary degrees.

Kehilath Jeshurun, together with all American Israel, glories in the great day "that the Lord hath made", and extends its greetings to the Yeshiva and its warmest wishes to the new president.

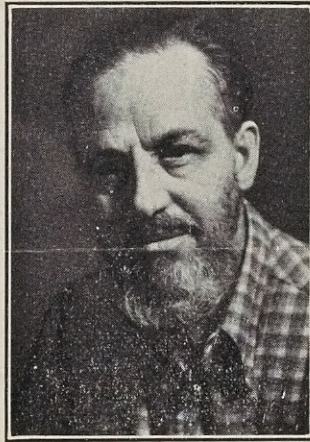
