"REFORM JUDAISM: HAS IT SUCCEEDED?"

Important Serman Series Begins This Saturday

This Saturday morning, Rabbi Lookstein will begin a series of sermons on the general subject, "Israel at the Religious Crossroads". The title of this Saturday's sermon, the first in the series, will be "Reform Judaism: Has it Succeeded?". On the succeeding Saturdays, he will speak on "Conservative Judaism: What Is it Really Conserving?"; "Reconand "Orthodox Judaism: Its Achievements and Opportunities".

This series of sermons will deal fearlessly with some of the most challenging religious problems in Jewish life today. It will offer a careful analysis and a courageous critique of the current versions of Judaism.

Many of us are disturbed today by the state of Jewish religious life. Some of us are groping for new paths and are stumbling in the process or are arriving at dead ends. Here is an opportunity for a measure of enlightenment and guidance.

We urge our congregants and all serious thinking Jews in the community to listen to this series. We invite especially the young people of the community to come.
