THE CHALLENGE TO ORTHODOX JUDAISM

This Saturday morning Rabbi Lookstein will conclude his series of four lectures on "Israel at the Religious Crossroads." The Rabbi will discuss "Orthodox Judaism — Its Achievements and Opportunities."

The analysis of Reconstructionist Judaism and the forthright critique of it was exceptionally well received last Saturday morning. The Rabbi spoke for over an hour and a large congregation of men and women from Yorkville and the West Side listened most attentively.

We may expect in the concluding lecture a presentation of the orthodox point of view that can come only from one who is a leading spokesman of that point of view. What are the achievements of Orthodox Judaism? Wherein has it failed? What are its shortcomings? Can it meet the challenge of a new day and of our critical times? The Rabbi will deal with all of these questions authoritatively and fearlessly.

If you are one of those who heard the three previous lectures you will need no coaxing to hear the concluding one. If for some reason you have missed the series thus far then you owe it to yourself to hear this closing lecture.
