AN OPEN LETTER FROM THE RABBI

Dear Congregants:

The blood of our brethren is calling to us. Tens of thousands of our kin are suffering from starvation and disease on the blood-drenched continent of Europe. Many thousands are still under the tyrant's heel. Some of these may be saved, as indeed some have been saved.

It is not always possible to bring relief and salvation through the recognized agencies of relief. Sometimes, underground methods have to be used. Whatever the means, and however desperate the methods, we must resort to them. All that is needed is money, more money, and still more money. It is little indeed, when one contemplates the preciousness of a single human life.

Please, therefore, respond more generously than ever to our Passover Appeal this year. The largest portion of the proceeds will go for the purposes described above through the Vaad Hahatzala, the one organization that is effecting the rescue through heroic underground methods. If you have not sent in your contribution to the Passover Appeal yet, please do so immediately. If you have and would care to increase your contribution, please do so. Remember, dear friends, what your generosity will accomplish this year, and act accordingly. God bless you for all that you will do.

RAMAZ TO OPEN HIGH SCHOOL

Before a meeting of the Parents Council last Tuesday, Rabbi Lookstein announced that the Ramaz School received permission from the Board of Regents to proceed with the establishment of a high school. To obtain this permission, the Rabbi visited Albany to confer with the head of the Department of Secondary Education. Last week, a representative of the department visited the Ramaz School in order to make the necessary arrangements for the opening of the high school next September.

Ramaz thus enters a very important phase in the course of its phenomenal growth. It is exactly eight years since the elementary department was organized. The experiment, therefore, to provide an integrated General and Jewish education may be said to have met with success. We have every reason to hope that the attempt to extend this experiment to the high school level will meet with a similar success.

PASSOVER NOTES SPECIAL CAUTION

The Passover season is one that affords the unscrupulous an opportunity to practice fraud and deception upon the observant. A variety of food articles are offered for sale under all guises which are actually forbidden for use. The fact that these articles are sold in the Passover repartments of leading department stores is no quarantee of Koshrut. Only the endorsement of a recognized rabbinic organization may be depended upon. Since not all are familiar with the status of endorsers, it is advisable always to consult the rabbi when in doubt.

SALE OF CHOMETZ

Rabbi Lookstein will be available beginning with Thursday, March 22nd for the sale of Chometz. The Rabbi may be found in the synagogue office daily.

For those who cannot take care of this important ritual in person, the attached form may be used. It must, however, be returned to the Rabbi no later than by Tuesday, March 27th.


