A PRAYER FOR OUR BOYS

The following is a prayer composed by Rabbi Lookstein and which he suggests should be recited in every home at the Seder table:

WOULD YOU SAVE THE LIFE OF A JEW?

Suppose you had an opportunity to save a fellow Jew somewhere in liberated or occupied Europe. Suppose you could salvage a Jewish child and give him a new chance to live. There is no doubt that you would do your utmost to do that.

Here is an opportunity. Our Passover appeal will allocate a substantial part of its proceeds to the work of the Vaad Hahatzala. That organization, through underground channels, daily saves Jewish lives. There are men in the underground who are risking their lives every minute of the day. All we ask of you is to give us some of your means in order that this life-saving work may go on.

The Passover appeal thus far is very disappointing in its results. Only \$1,400 have been raised out of the badly needed \$5,000. Many of our people have not responded. Delay at a time like this is hazardous. Neglect is sinful. Before you put this bulletin aside, please make out your check and send it to us. Your kindness and generosity will add to your Passover joy.

PRE-PASSOVER NOTES

A special service for the first-born will be held on Wednesday morning following the regular services, which will take place at 7:30 in the chapel. If you are a first-born, you are obligated to attend this service. If your first-born is too young to come himself, come along with him.

Rabbi Lookstein will be available for the sale of Chometz all of this week until Wednesday morning. Those who cannot attend to this matter in person may avail themselves of the special

form that appeared in last week's bulletin.

An "Eruv Tavshilin" must be arranged on Wednesday before sundown in order to permit the preparation of food on the holiday for the Sabbath which follows.

Saturday before Passover is known as "Shabbat Hagadol" or "The Great Sabbath". It is one of the special Sabbaths of the year. Liturgically and sermonically, one can also feel on this Sabbath the twang of Passover. Do come to synagogue this Saturday.
