THE YISKOR APPEAL

ON SHEVUOTH

There is a passage in the traditional memorial service read by everyone who recites Yiskor, in which he pledges a charitable offering in memory of the deceased whom he memorializes.

In order that such a holy pronouncement may be properly fulfilled, it was our custom in former years to make an appeal on Shevuoth at Yiskor time and allow our worshippers to announce their contributions in memory of their dear departed ones. The contributions made at that time, it was understood, would serve as an all-inclusive offering covering the four occasions during the year when Yiskor is recited.

In order to emphasize the purely religious character of the offering, it was insisted that it be no less than five dollars and no more than ten dollars. Thus, the offering was purged of any material tinge and represented purely a token of reverence for the departed.

This year, we wish to modify the procedure in connection with the Yiskor appeal. We want to eliminate any public appeal and any announcement of contributions. We feel that that impairs the dignity and the impressiveness of the Yiskor service. Instead we should like all our congregants to send us their Yiskor offerings by mail. Please, therefore, send us your offering in accordance

V—E DAY NOTICE

The gruesome price of victory and the unfinished task in the Pacific should determine the mood of sobriety and humility on V—E Day.

Our synagogue will remain open on V—E Day for prayer and meditation. An official service will be held in the main synagogue at eight o'clock on the evening of that day. Should victory be officially announced after six o'clock in the evening, the official service will be held on the evening following.

Be sure to be in the synagogue with your families on V—E Day. May it come speedily.
