V-E DAY SERVICES

A large congregation gathered in the main synagogue on Tuesday evening, V-E Day for prayer and thanksgiving. Mr. Max J. Etra, president introduced the guest speaker, Rabbi Abraham N. Zuroff. Rabbi Zuroff opened the services with a talk on the symbolism of the letter V and what it did to inject a fighting spirit in the people of Great Britain, France and the other occupied countries at the time when Hitler hordes were at the peak of their triumph.

Speaking of the so-called greatness and genius attributed to Hitler in some circles, Rabbi Zuroff said, that such greatness can also be claimed by the germ that spread the devastating bubonic plague on the European continent during the middle ages. This germ also did a remarkable job of destruction and annihilation on the continent.

The congregation rose before the open ark while Rabbi Zuroff read a prayer composed by Rabbi Lookstein for that service. Cantor Victor Gold led the congregation in the special order of prayers that were arranged for this service.
