ARCHITECT SUBMITS PLANS FOR REMODELING OF SYNAGOGUE AND SCHOOL BUILDING

Mr. J. M. Berlinger, the well knwn architect, presented the first draft of the plans for the remodeling of our synagogue building and for the alteration of our newly acquired school and Synagogue House.

The plans call for the relighting, reheating, redecorating, and recarpeting of the main synagogue. They provide for the installation of an elevator that will be used jointly by the synagogue and school buildings. The entire lower floor of the synagogue, according to these plans, will be remodelled. A new and air-conditioned chapel will be built that will be the most beautiful thing of its kind. A spacious Social Hall to accommodate 250 people, with all modern kitchen facilities, is included in the plans. The entire front of the synagogue will be remodelled and the entrance from the street level will lead to spacious lobbies and beautifully decorated foyers.

The Synagogue House will also undergo extensive alterations. The auditorium, to accommodate 300, with stage and movie projection facilities, will occupy the main floor. Magnificent lounges and attractive lobbies are called for in the plans. Ample classroom space will of course be provided to accommodate the Ramaz School, and

the afternoon Religious School. The roof of the building will become an outdoor play area and equipped with all necessary facilities. The gymnasium will of course be completely refitted with all necessary athletic equipment. Our Synagogue House will thus become a recreational and educational center of matchless beauty and service.

The plans are being studied now by the Building Alterations Committee under the chairmanship of Mr. Samuel Levy. They will shortly be presented to the Board of Trustees and then of course to the membership. Just as soon as the plans are approved, a booklet containing drawings, designs, and sketches of the remodelled synagogue and school buildings, showing the new and improved facilities, will be prepared and placed in the hands of our members and seat holders.

We are confident that every member and friend of Kehilath Jeshurun must be thrilled with these new developments in our program of expansion. Those who have made this possible through their effort and generosity must indeed rejoice. Those who will continue their interest and generosity until these plans are fully materialized, will have ever-increasing cause for gratification.

DR. BENJAMIN BRICKMAN FATHER'S DAY SPEAKER

Dr. Benjamin Brickman, supervisor of Ramaz School has been designated by the Men's Club of the congregation as the preacher at the Father's Day services to be held under the sponsorship of the Men's Club on Saturday, June 16th. It has become an established practice to select some outstanding member of the Men's Club and confer upon him the honor of occupying the pulpit on Father's Day Sabbath.

Dr. Benjamin Brickman is an excellent product of the integration of Judaism and Americanism. He received his early training at the Yeshiva of Harlem and in the Talmudical Academy of Yeshiva College. His academic training was received at City College and Columbia University. From the latter institution he holds the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. At the present time, Dr. Brickman is a member of the faculty of Brooklyn College.

The Father's Day Sabbath Services will be conducted by the students of Ramaz School. The weekly portion will be read by them and the Musaf service will be conducted by one of them. The congregational songs that day will be under the leadership of Shalom Altman, music teacher at Ramaz. The children of the Central Jewish Institute Talmud Torah will also participate in the service.

The Men's Club is preparing to serve a buffet kiddush after the services in honor of the fathers of the congregation who will of course be the honored guests on that occasion.
