1. Admission to Services during the High Holy Days Season will be by card only. This rule will be strictly enforced. On the Sabbath, when carrying is not permitted, kindly give your name to officer at door.

2. Come to the Services as early as you possibly can.

3. Please join in the congregational singing.

4. Conversation of any kind is for-

bidden during the Services. Proper decorum is essential for dignified worship.

5. The doors are closed during the sermon. Please, therefore, be in your seat before the sermon begins.

6. Please do not remove Talith or leave your seat until after the benediction is pronounced at the close of the Service.

7. Very young children should not be brought to the synagogue. They only disturb the Services and annoy those around them.

8. The synagogue ushers do their job voluntarily and devotedly. Please cooperate with them by respecting their wishes.

Rabbi Lookstein will preach both days of the Holiday at 10:30 A.M.

THE SYNAGOGUE HOUSE

During the summer months the Synagogue House was undergoing extensive alterations. These alterations are still going on and when completed will make us proud of our Synagogue House. Additional improvements are of course planned. The architect's plans for the permanent alteration of the synagogue and Synagogue House have already been submitted and await only the approval of the Board of Trustees. Some very interesting news on that subject will shortly be made known.

At this time the profound gratitude of the congregation and all its affiliates is extended to Mr. George Jacobs who, on behalf of the Building Alterations Committee, supervised all the work done. Mr. Jacobs forewent his summer vacation in order to supervise the work. His unfailing attention and his devoted service camnot be overestimated. Our thanks to him for all that he did.

Welcome to New Pupils

To the boys and girls who are now enrolled in our Religious School we extend a hearty "Shalom" with best wishes for a very successful school year. We are certain that they will find it very pleasant to pursue their Hebrew studies in our school with its excellent staff of teachers, large and airy classrooms, attractive auditorium and gymnasium and other desirable school facilities.

Pupils Attend Opening Assembly

Thursday, September 6th, marked the opening of the new term in the Religious School. The pupils who attended last year, as well as the newly enrolled pupils, assembled in the auditorium of the Synagogue House. Mr. Axelrod, the new principal, greeted the happy youngsters and welcomed them back to school. He explained to them the organization of the school and outlined the program of studies for the year. The children received their class assignments and greeted their new teachers. An interesting program of entertainment concluded the assembly program.

Sessions Start September 10th

Regular classes in the Religious School will begin on Monday afternoon, September 10th, at 4 o'clock. Children whose classes meet on Monday and Wednesday will report to the first session on Monday. All others will report on Tuesday afternoon at 4 o'clock. Former pupils who have not received their class assignments should report to the principal's office.

Registration of New Pupils Continues

The enrollment of new pupils for the Religious School will continue throughout the month of September. Each child will be interviewed by the principal and assigned to a class in accordance with his age and ability. Parents are earnestly requested to enroll their children early since a day missed is a day lost.

Classes for High School Students

Today, we hope it is no longer necessary to convince Jewish parents of the importance of continuing the Hebrew education of their children after Bar Mitzva or graduation. Events of the past few years and, especially, the religious experiences of our young men and women in the armed forces should impress both parents and children with the necessity of a comprehensive Jewish education that should begin at an early age and continue through the adolescent period.

In our afternoon Religious School we plan to organize specia! classes for junior and senior high school students as well as for post-Bar Mitzva boys who wish to continue with their Hebrew studies. Sessions will be held three times a week at hours most convenient to them. The course of study will include Hebrew Language, Bible and Jewish History. Students who are interested may register in the school office.
