RABBI LOOKSTEIN

AT MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein was one of the speakers at the huge demonstration at Madison Square Garden on Sunday night, September 30th, in protest of British policy toward Palestine. He spoke as a representative of the Mizrachi Organization of America.

The Rabbi said in part, "The day when the dreams and hopes of an ancient people will be liquidated will be a day that will live in infamy . . . The heroes of Bataan and

Corregidor no less than the heroes of the Warsaw Ghetto will have died in vain . . . The most emphatic declaration that truth has triumphed and the international integrity and not international treachery will henceforth be the policy of the world, will be the keeping of the pledge made by fifty-three nations to the Jewish people to establish Palestine as a Jewish Commonwealth . . . G-d forbid that humanity be made to witness once again an international Pearl Harbor with the hopes and aspirations of an ancient people sunk by indifference of some nations and the betrayal of others."

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS

Our Junior Congregation:

One of the important objectives of our Religious School program is the cultivation of intelligent and meaningful participation in synagogue worship. We want our children to be able to chant the beautiful Hebrew prayers and to become familiar with their content and meaning. We want them to develop an attitude of reverence toward public worship and to derive spiritual satisfaction from prayer and devotion.

In order to realize this aim, we have organized a junior congregation which conducts a children's service every Sabbath morning at 10 o'clock in the chapel of our synagogue.

The service is conducted in a manner that is most intelligible and enjoyable to the child. It includes congregational singing, responsive reading of certain prayers in Hebrew and in English, the reading of the Torah and a sermonette on the weekly portion. Each child is provided with a talis and prayer book. Upon the conclusion of the service a Kiddush is served in the Social Hall followed by an "Oneg Shabbat" program of
