### RABBI TO DISCUSS RECONSTRUC-TIONIST PRAYER BOOK

For two successive Saturdays, on the 20th and the 27th of October, Rabbi Lookstein will discuss the recently published Reconstructionist prayer book. On the 20th his subject will be: "The Composition of the Prayer Book," and on the 27th, "The Consequences of the Prayer Book."

The entire episode of the prayer book has been one of confusion during which agitation and passions ran high on all sides. The Union of Orthodox Rabbis pronounced a "Herem" on the book and its author. The three leading professors of the Jewish Theological Seminary denounced the book. The Jewish and Hebrew press reacted similarly.

On the other hand, many have come to the defense of the prayer book and its author. There was great excitement over the "Herem" and strong opposition to its use as an instrument in our day. The issue of freedom of worship was invoked, and the larger issue of religious freedom was raised.

In the light of these developments it is important that an intelligent orthodox congregation hear a comprehensive statement on the entire subject. Those who have heard the Rabbi's sermons last season on the different versions of Judaism know that they may expect a fair and forthright exposition of the subject. Make sure, therefore, to attend services on the 20th and the 27th of October.

### RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS Children's Services Begin Oct. 13th.

The Junior Congregation invites all the pupils of the Religious School and their friends to the children's services held in the chapel of the synagogue every Sabbath morning at 10 o'clock.

The services are conducted in a manner that is intelligible and enjoyable to children. Those who attend regularly acquire the ability to read fluently and to chant the beautiful Hebrew prayers. The knowledge and understanding of the ritual enables them to derive religious inspiration from synagogue worship.

At the conclusion of the service a Kiddush is served in the Social Hall followed by an "Oneg Shabbat" program of Sabbath songs and stories.

### Our Sunday Morning Program.

The Religious School does not conduct a separate Sunday School. All of our children attend three times a week—two afternoons and Sunday morning from 9:30 to 12:30.

The program of studies on Sunday therefore, includes regular classroom instruction in Prayers, Hebrew Language and Jewish History. In addition, two periods are devoted to Hebrew Music and club activities. Children may choose one of the following clubs: Arts and Crafts, Dramatics, Palestine Folk Dancing and a Bar Mitzvah club. These activities, which are designed for enjoyment and appreciation, afford our children an opportunity for creative expression.
