Dr. Sachar Addresses October Forum:

Before an appreciative audience that attended our monthly forum on Tuesday, October 16th, Dr. Sachar delivered an eloquent address on the subject of "Jewish Faith in the Future." As National Director of the Hillel Foundation, Dr. Sachar has had the opportunity to study the behavior, as well as the social attitudes of Jewish students in our colleges and universities. He finds that many of them suffer from a feeling of inadequacy and insecurity, which is undoubtedly due to a lack of proper orientation and appreciation of their cultural heritage. He deplored the tendency, on the part of well-meaning people, to indulge in apologetics and to seek reasons to justify the national existence of the Jew in modern society. As a matter of fact, the Jew need not resort to sympathy and mercy in order to seek the good-will of his non-Jewish neighbor. A fuller understanding, by both Jew and Gentile alike, of the history and achievements of the Jewish people, in the past as well as in the present, will make for a better adjustment and create normal and wholesome attitudes in our Jewish youth. He cited the fine work that the Hillel Foundation has accomplished in this direction.

Rabbi Lookstein followed the main speaker with a short talk on the need to extend the work of the Hillel Foundation to the universities in South America.

Mr. Ira F. Weisman, President of the Men's Club, presented to the Congregation a check for \$500.00 which represents the contribution of the organization to the Religious School Fund. The gift was acknowledged with thanks by Mr. Saul Lance, Vice President of the Congregation.

The Men's Club is very grateful to

its devoted member, Mr. Thomas. Bornstein, for his generous contribution toward the collation served that evening.
