CHAPLAIN HERSCHEL SCHACTER GUEST RABBI

Before departing for Europe Rabbi Lookstein invited a number of outstanding guest rabbis to occupy the pulpit on Sabbath mornings during his absence. This Sabbath, December 22nd, we shall have the pleasure of welcoming to our synagogue the first guest rabbi Chaplain Herschel Schacter.

Chaplain Schacter, who is a graduate of Yeshiva College, has been the rabbi of a large congregation in Stamford, Connecticut. For the past three years he served as chaplain in the U. S. Army. He took part in the invasion of Normandy, the Battle of the Bulge, and was the first Jewish chaplain to visit the concentration camps in Germany. He not only brought material aid to the suffering Jews there but helped them organize a congregation and a Talmud Torah.

Chaplain Schacter is an eloquent and forceful speaker. We look forward to greeting him this Sabbath and we eagerly await his message. The title of his sermon will be: "The Land of the Living Dead."
