RABBI LOOKSTEIN VISITS JEWISH CAMPS

We have received word from our Rabbi that he is now in the American Zone in Germany. He spent some time in Frankfurt-am-Main, Heidelberg and Munich, and visited several camps for displaced Jews in those areas.

According to an Associated Press dispatch, which was recently published in the newspapers, Rabbi Lookstein visited the Zeilheim displaced persons' camp near Heidelberg and observed conditions there.

The Rabbi, who is traveling on a chaplaincy mission for the War Department, will also visit Italy, North Africa and Palestine. He is expected to complete his trip in six weeks and will return to the United States early in February.
