SHABBAT SHIRAH

Our guest rabbi on this special Sabbath will be Chaplain Norman Siegel who has recently returned from overseas duty. The subject of his sermon will be "Sing No Song of Jubilation."

Chaplain Siegel, who is a graduate of Yeshivah University, served as rabbi of Monticello, New York. For the past five years he was on active duty as chaplain in the U. S. Army, and spent forty-three months overseas. He was awarded the bronze star medal for meritorious service in military operations against the enemy in the Pacific area. After separation from the services he will become the rabbi of the Congregation Beth Israel of New Orleans.

We welcome Chaplain Siegel to our synagogue, and extend to him our good wishes upon his return to civilian life.

"SHALOM ALEICHEM BROTHERS!"

(Excerpt from a letter by Rabbi Lookstein.)

"I visited my first concentration camp, or as it is now called, Assembly Center for Displaced Persons. It was a soul-shaking and nerveshattering experience. The camp is about ten miles from Frankfort and is called Zeilsheim. It was formerly used as a slave labor camp for Russians, and after liberation became a Displaced Persons Center. There are twenty-seven hundred Jews there and their number is being augmented daily by those who filter in from Poland after going through the most excruciating hardships to reach it.

"Just as soon as I stepped out of my staff car, word circulated, I don't know how, that an American Rabbi, who was a presidential visitor, arrived. I was surrounded by hundreds of men, women and children who stood for a time at a respectful distance. I loked at them and tears welled up in my eyes and I ex-claimed; "Shalom Aleichem, Brieder!" That was an electric spark that touched off pent-up emotions and relieved repressed feelings. They milled around me and I shook all hands, bent down and hugged the little ones, and was tempted to embrace them all. They followed me all through the camp on my inspection trip. Suddenly, the procession stopped. I saw an Eternal Light burning near a monument centered in a plot, neatly laid out and carefully graveled. I stopped and read the inscription on the monument dedicated to the martyred dead whose surviving relatives were in this camp. 1 stood there. Someone called for a photographer, but I dismissed him. I wouldn't permit that sacred moment to be vulgarized, nor my communion with the countless dead of my people to be profaned by the instruments of publicity. That mo-
