SABBATH ROSH CHODESH

Chaplain Rackman is a graduate of Yeshiva College. He also graduated with highest honors from Columbia University and the Columbia Law School. In civilian life he was rabbi in Lynbrook, L. I. For the past two and a half years he served as Chaplain at Randolph Field in Texas, and taught at the Air Corps Chaplains School in San Antonio, and the Army Chaplains School at Fort Oglethorpe.

Chaplain Rackman is a brilliant scholar and forceful speaker. We welcome him to our synagogue and eagerly await his message.

RABBI LOOKSTEIN LEAVES EUROPE

As we go to press we are informed that Rabbi Lookstein has completed his six-week chaplaincy mission in Europe, and is about to return to the United States. He is expected to leave the continent on or about Feb. 3rd, and should arrive in New York in a few days.

On this trip, the Rabbi visited the camps for displaced persons in the American zone of occupation in Germany and observed conditions there. He conferred with the Jewish chaplains and the military officials in those areas, and discussed with them the problems of the displaced Jews in the camps. The rabbi also had the opportunity to attend the Nurenberg trials where justice is being meted out to the Nazi criminals.

The Rabbi's observations and reports are eagerly awaited by the Jewish Welfare Board as well as by the other relief agencies. In view of the conflicting reports that reach us about the conditions of our Jewish brethren in Germany, his first-hand observations will undoubtedly give us a true picture of the situation as it really is.

Our congregation anxiously looks forward to his homecoming. We know that he will share with us his experiences and the impressions he gained on this momentous voyage.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL BEGINS NEW TERM


