PARENTS' COUNCIL TENDERS TESTIMONIAL TO RABBI LOOKSTEIN Large Sum Raised for Ramaz Building Fund

The Grand Ballroom of Hotel Pierre was filled to capacity last Sunday night by the parents and friends of Ramaz School who assembled to honor the founder and principal of the school at a Testimonial Dinner.

It was a function which has to be described in superlatives. A most attractive ballroom which resembled a bower of flowers: a superbly catered dinner; excellent music and high class entertainment; distinguished and world renowned scholars gracing a handsomely decorated dais; and a festive gathering of guests who seemed like one happy family; such was the Testimonial Dinner tendered to our Rabbi for whom all seemed to express aenuine admiration and affection

The guest speakers were Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of Yeshiva University and Professor Robert M. Mac-Iver, Chairman of the Department of Sociology of Columbia University under whom the Rabbi studied for his doctorate. Dr. Belkin in his address emphasized the uniqueness of the Ramaz School as a religious and educational medium for the American Jewish child of today. Professor MacIver lauded the institution as an exemplary instrument for the improvement of American democracy.

An impressive congregational touch was contributed by Mr. Saul J. Lance who spoke on behalf of the congregation and feelingly conveyed the sentiments of respect and affection that the membership cherishes for the Rabbi. The toastmaster of

the occasion, Mr. Max Sadinoff, Chairman of the Dinner Committee presided with grace over the evening's proceedings. He was introduced by the President of the Parents Council, Mrs. Milton Brown

A very handsome souvenir journal was published in honor of the occasion. The Chairman of the Journal Committee was Mr. Larry Friedberg and his Co-Chairman was Mr. Hyman Messeloff. Mr. Irving W. Schwartz was Co-Chairman of the Dinner Committee and Mr. Irving Kobrin served as Treasurer

Among the distinguished guests seated on the dais were Professors Joseph George Cohen of Brooklyn College and Pincus Churgin, Dean of Teachers' Institute of Yeshiva University.

Even the Grace which followed the dinner was just a little different. It was chanted by Mr. Joseph E. Adler in an atmosphere of reverence that seemed to blend beautifully with the dignity of the entire occasion. He also led in the singing of the National Anthem and the Hatikva. The invocation was pronounced by Dr. Solomon Wind of Yeshiva University.

The guest of honor was naturally the closing speaker of the evening. He spoke with humility and gratitude, and emphasized the part that Kehilath Jeshurun played in the founding and sponsorship of Ramaz. "If we have attained success and recognition for our educational enterprise," the Rabbi said, "then it is to

PRE-PASSOVER NOTES

The Sabbath before Passover is known as "Shabbat Hagodol" or "The Great Sabbath." In addition to the regular services there are special liturgical readings which deal with the significance and observance of the Passover holiday. In the afternoon it is also customary to read the Haggadah in anticipation of the Seder services.

On Monday morning, Erev Pesach, immediately following the regular morning service a special service for the first-born will be held in the chapel. If you are a first-born you are obligated to attend this service. If your first-born is too young to come himself, come along with him.

Rabbi Lookstein will be available for the sale of Chometz until Monday morning. Those who cannot take care of this important ritual in person, may use the special form which was enclosed with last week's bulletin. This form, must be returned to the Rabbi no later than Monday morning, April 15th.
