10,000 POUNDS OF FOOD SENT TO EUROPEAN JEWS

We are indeed happy to report to our many congregants and friends that as a result of their generous contributions to our Passover Appeal, we were able to send 10,000 pounds of food to our needy brethren in war-torn Europe. This direct shipment, in addition to our contribution to the S.O.S. food and clothing drive, will bring some measure of relief to the distressed Jews who are now in the D.P. camps in Germany.

We have also provided for the needy of our community by giving One Thousand Dollars to the York-ville Passover Fund. In addition we distributed food and clothing to deserving families who do not come to the attention of organized charities.

To the Ezras Torah Fund which aids destitute and indigent rabbis, both here and abroad, we have contributed \$200.00. Substantial sums were sent to Palestine for the relief of refugee rabbis, to the HIAS and to the League for Religious Labor in Palestine.

All these contributions and benevolences were made possible by our Benevolent Fund which functions not only before Passover, but all year round. Won't you help us sustain this work of charity and mercy by contributing regularly to this fund. Remember that one hundred percent of every dollar that you give goes directly to a worthy cause and helps to alleviate want and suffering.
