The second meeting of the After-Religious School Parents' noon Council was held last Thursday in the Social Hall. The Chairman, Mr. David Hersch, opened the meeting and greeted the parents and teachers. After the reading of the minutes by the Secretary, Mrs. Abraham Gewertz, the principal of the school, Mr. Axelrod, gave a comprehensive report on the activities of the school, as well as on the attainments of the pupils in the past eight months.
