The mothers who attended our synagogue on Saturday, May 11th, and participated in the special Mother's Day service sponsored by our Sisterhood were honored in a very unique manner. A tree was planted in Palestine in the name of every mother who attended that service. We have just received from the Jewish National Fund the tree certificates which will be forwarded to those who are entitled to them.

ADULT COURSES END

Last January our Religious School, through its extension division, instituted a series of unit courses in Jewish studies for young people and adults. The response to this program has been very gratifying. Many of our members and friends regularly attended these courses that were given on Monday evenings and have thus enriched their knowledge of Hebrew and Jewish history.

The courses have just been concluded and we can at this time summarize the accomplishments of the students. Those who took the beginner's course in Hebrew can now read the prayer book fluently and will thus be able to participate more intelligently in synagogue services. Those who took conversational Hebrew have acquired a substantial vocabulary and are able to express themselves in the language. The course in history has given the students a survey of events and personalities that have shaped Jewish life from the Biblical period until modern times.

For next year, we plan to expand our program of adult education in the hope of reaching many more Jewish men and women who can profit from these courses.

ATTENTION GRADUATES

We are anxious to print in our bulletin, the names of our young congregants who have completed their courses of study at elementary schools, high schools and colleges. We would like to offer them our congratulations and we want the congregation to know of the milestone that they have reached.
