DIAMOND JUBILEE PROCLAIMED ON YOM KIPPUR

The impressiveness of Kol Nidre night was enhanced in our congregation this year by the proclamation of the Diamond Jubilee Year which was thus ushered in.

There was a tense and touching moment as the procession of the Board of Trustees of the congregation entered the synagogue. Heading the procession were the officers of the congregation, carrying the Torah Scrolls dressed in their white vestments. Cantor Gertler, at the center reading desk, chanted Psalm 24. Before the open Ark, Rabbi Lookstein read a special prayer composed for the occasion.

The Kol Nidre appeal, which later followed, was conducted without the announcement of contributions and with the other public features of it eliminated. There was a brief statement by the Rabbi explaining the purpose and goal of the Diamond Jubilee Fund, and then the pledge booklets which had been distributed among the worshippers were collected by the ushers. We are pleased to announce that the response was generous and the results most gratifying.

CLASSES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Recognizing the need of furthering the Jewish education of the adolescent boy and girl, our Religious School has set up a High School Department which offers young people an opportunity to continue with their Jewish studies at hours most convenient to them.

Courses in the Hebrew Language, Bible, Talmud, Jewish History, and Jewish Laws and Customs are given in the late afternoons and evenings. There are classes for beginners as well as for advanced students. Special courses will also be given at the request of a sufficient number of students.

Our Educational Director, Mr. Herman C. Axelrod will be glad to confer with students and assist in planning an adequate program of studies for them. Our office is open for registration, daily from 9:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. and on Sunday mornings from 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M.

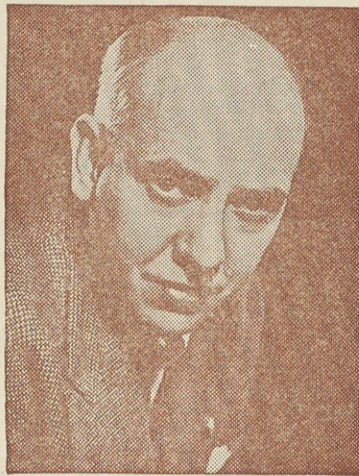
