CONGREGANTS CONTRIBUTE OVER \$200,000 TO UJA

In response to an appeal made by the Rabbi before the Yiskor services on Shemini Atzereth, the members and worshippers pledged amounts totaling over \$200,000. A number of contributions announced had been previously pledged in the trade and professional divisions organized by the United Jewish Appeal. The largest number, however, represented initial gifts made for the first time in the current year's campaign.

While we are very gratified with the response, we are striving for even better results. Our goal is to have every member and seat-holder of our congregation contribute to the UJA. Rabbi Lookstein put it well when he said, "We mean to exert every pressure in order to obtain the maximum results. If some be offended, then it is better to offend a living Jew than the memory of a martyred Jew." We ask our donors to be good enough and send in their checks to the synagogue office, made payable to the United Jewish Appeal. They will receive a temporary receipt from us and, subsequently, an acknowledgement from the UJA office.

We appeal to those who have not yet made their 1946 contributions to please respond at once. Help us achieve our goal—every member a donor to UJA.

KEHILATH JESHURUN OPENS INSTITUTE FOR JEWISH STUDIES

Last year our congregation initiated a program of evening courses for men and women. The response to this program was so gratifying and the results so favorable that the congregation has decided to expand this program for the coming year and to establish an Institute for Jewish Studies that will be devoted to the furtherance of adult education.

We know that our members and friends will welcome this good news, and we invite them to take full advantage of the opportunities for cultural enrichment that are being offered by the Institute.

The program of Jewish studies planned for the year includes unit courses in the Hebrew Language, Bible, Jewish History, Zionism and Palestine, Jewish Laws and Customs, The Prayer Book, Jewish Music, and Yiddish language and literature. There will be classes for beginners as well as for advanced students. In addition to these courses, special study groups will be formed in any subject upon the request of a sufficient number of students at hours most convenient to them.

Each class will meet once a week for a period of 30 weeks. A Certificate of Accomplishment will be issued to students upon the satisfactory completion of each course.

The faculty of the Institute consists of highly qualified teachers who are experts in the field of Jewish education. Some of them are on the teaching staff of the Ramaz School and of our afternoon Religious School.

A prospectus of the Institute with the full list of courses is now in preparation and will be mailed shortly to our readers. For further information regarding the Institute and its program apply to our Educational Director, Mr. Herman C. Axelrod.
