### DIAMOND JUBILEE YEAR-BOOK TO BE PUBLISHED

#### \$25,000.00 Quota Set

Work on the Diamond Jubilee Yearbook will begin in a few days. A committee headed by Mr. Samuel A. Marcus as Chairman, with Mr. Sol Lustbader and Mr. Elliott W. Siegel as Co-Chairmen has already been appointed. The names of the other members of the committee will appear in next week's bulletin.

The yearbook contemplated will naturally reflect the historic character of the Diamond Jubilee. In addition to the usual material, it will contain a historic survey of the congregation, pictures of the early founders and of some of the significant events of the last seventy-five years in congregational history. A special artist has been engaged to be in charge of the art work, and a research worker is assembling the important historical data for the volume. When complete, the Diamond Jubilee Yearbook will be a contribution to the better understanding of the history of the Jewish community of New York.

In the supplementary section of the yearbook will appear advertisements and compliments of friends and well wishers of the congregation, as well as greetings from national, state, and city officials. A goal of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars has been set to be raised from the compliments and ads that we expect the membership to procure. A substantial part of the proceeds will be allocated to the Diamond Jubilee Fund.

# JAMES G. McDONALD TO BE THANKSGIVING SPEAKER

The Thanksgiving service on November 28th next will have as its guest speaker the outstanding scholar and leader in world affairs, Dr. James G. McDonald. The Thanksgiving service which always brings out a capacity audience will be conducted by the Rabbi. Cantor Hyman Gertler will of course chant the prayers and he will be assisted by a choir under the direction of Reuben Kazimirsky.

The qualities and achievements of the guest speaker are too numerous to mention. To the Jewish people, he is especially known as the High Commissioner for Refugees appointed by the League of Nations and for his championship of the Jewish cause as one of the leading members of the Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry on Palestine. To the former office, he was recommended by the late President Roosevelt and to the latter by President Harry S. Truman. Dr. McDonald is a figure of world renown and a personality revered and esteemed universally.

The Thanksgiving service has become an established institution in our congregation. From all over the city people stream to attend a service that is both traditional and modern, that is pious and impressive. We are of course especially anxious to have our own congregants attend. We want it to be an occasion when fathers, mothers and children get together on a great American national holiday which has such deep religious significance.

Those who have attended this service in the past will not need further urging. To our new members and seatholders and to all those who have not yet participated in the service, we extend a cordial invitation to be with us on Thanksgiving morning.

The service begins promptly at 11:00 A.M. and is over by 12:30.

#### THIS SATURDAY'S SERMON

There is a current play on Broadway called, "A Flag is Born" written by the famous dramatist, Ben Hecht. This play has won wide acclaim and is now being played before crowded houses. It was banned in England where an attempt was made to stage it. It deals with the problems of the Jew and his struggle to re-establish Palestine as a Jewish State. It glorifies especially the heroic efforts of the Jewish resistance movement.

This Saturday morning, Rabbi Lookstein will deliver an address entitled, "How is a Jewish Flag Born." Based on this play, the Rabbi will analyze some of the implications that are suggested by it, and will discuss the new strategy of Jewish nationalism as it is reflected in the Yishuv in Palestine and by Zionist action in America. We have reason to believe that the Rabbi's address this Saturday will be one that ought not to be missed.

### MANY ENROLL IN OUR INSTI-TUTE FOR JEWISH STUDIES

The response to the adult education program sponsored by our Institute for Jewish Studies has been most gratifying. Many men and women have already taken advantage of the opportunities offered by this cultural program and have enrolled in one or more of the courses.

It is particularly encouraging to note the great interest in the study of modern Hebrew. To meet the demand for this subject the Institute has opened four classes, in order to accommodate beginners as well as advanced students. The other subjects offered are Bible, History, Religion and Yiddish.

It must again be emphasized that sessions in each subject are held only once a week. This should make it possible for everyone to enroll. The registration period will close next Monday, November 18th. No new students will be admitted after that date.
