As a war correspondent, Mr. Sheean traveled widely and observed first hand the political conditions in Europe and Asia. His analysis of the problems facing the world today was most illuminating and thought provoking. At the close of the meeting, Mr. Ira F. Weisman invited the entire audience to the social hall where a collation was served.

Father and Son Minyan and Breakfast

Last Sunday morning, our Bar Mitzvah boys and their fathers gathered in the chapel of our synagogue to conduct Rosh Chodesh services, and to take part in the Father and Son Breakfast which followed. It was a very impressive religious experience to the boys as well as to their parents

The services were conducted by the boys. Haskel Lookstein officiated as Chazan and Jacob Bloom read the Torah. The benediction was pronounced by Elliott Messing. At the breakfast table, Rabbi Lookstein extended cordial greetings to the boys, their fathers, and to the members of the Men's Club who sponsored the breakfast. He voiced his admiration for the fine service that the Bar Mitzvah group conducts every Sunday and expressed the hope that this will become a permanent institution in the congregation. The Rabbi thanked Mr. Ira F. Weisman and Mr. Alex Garfein for their efforts in planning and arranging the breakfast. The members of the Men's Club who were present were so impressed with the splendid turnout on Sunday, that they decided to make the breakfast a weekly feature of the Post-Bar Mitzvah Minyan.
