#### THIS SATURDAY'S SERMON

The Zionist Congress opens in Basle this week. This will be the first Congress since 1939. The desperation of close to 200,000 Jews in the Displaced Persons' Camps of Europe is acute. Shall and will a partitioned Jewish state be set up in Palestine? —is the question that is agitating the minds of all thinking Jews. All of these matters will be brought before the Zionist Congress.

Rabbi Lookstein, who was elected as a delegate but relinquished his place to an alternate because of his occupation with the Diamond Jubilee Year, has been and is very close to all of the problems enumerated above. He has chosen as his topic for this Saturday's sermon, "From Basle to Basle—Fifty Years of Zionist History." The subject should interest all of us and the Rabbi's discussion of it is bound to be informative, enlightening and inspiring. Be sure to be in the synagogue this Saturday in order not to miss this all-important sermon.

He will discuss the education of the new generation in Palestine as well as some of the newer approaches in child training. His talk promises to be very interesting and illuminating.

The teachers will, of course, be there and parents will have an opportunity to confer with them before and after the meeting.

# IMPRESSIVE THANKSGIVING SERVICE

"Most inspiring and enlightening" —these are the two adjectives that can best describe the Thanksgiving Service held in our synagogue, Thursday morning, November 28th. A very large congregation of men and women, many of whom came from all parts of the city filled the main synagogue and eagerly participated in the holiday services that were conducted by Rabbi Lookstein. The musical part of the service was rendered by Cantor Hyman Gertler and choir.

The guest speaker was the outstanding scholar and humanitarian, James McDonald, who delivered an eloquent address on the subject, "Palestine, A World Problem."

Mr. McDonald who was High Commissioner for Refugees during the war and a member of the recent Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry on Palestine, shared with the audience his experiences and observations in Europe and in Palestine. He vividly depicted the tragic plight of the Jewish survivors in war-torn countries, and spoke with enthusiasm and admiration of the stupendous achievements of the Yishuv in Palestine. He spared no words in condemning the British policy towards Palestine—a policy that is based on "high promises and merely empty fullfillments."

The beautiful Thanksgiving Service and the stirring address by Mr. Mc-Donald left a lasting impression on all.
