He served as Rabbi at the Young Israel of Cincinnati and for the past two years has been the successor to the late Rabbi Dr. Bernard Drachman at the Zichron Ephraim Congregation. We welcome Rabbi Reichel to our synagogue and eagerly look forward to his message.

### **JEWISH ARBOR DAY**

Wednesday, February 5, is Hamisha Asar Bi-Shevat—Jewish Arbor Day. This is the New Year of the Trees and marks the beginning of Spring in Palestine.
