PURIM CELEBRATION MARCH 9th Sponsored by the Men's Club and Sisterhood

The Men's Club and Sisterhood are jointly sponsoring a gala Purim Party which will be held in the Social Hall and the auditorium on Sunday evening, March 9th. A very fine program has been arranged for this occasion. It will include a buffet supper, music and holiday entertainment.

Cantor Hyman Gertler will present a program of Purim songs. The special feature of the evening will be the Ramaz Chorus of sixty voices in a delightful Purim operetta entitled, "Gilbert and Sullivan at Shushan." The chorus will be under the direction of Mr. Julius Grossman who will also lead the audience in community singing. In addition, the latest Palestine film in technicolor will be shown.

Reservations are now being accepted for this party. Because of limited accommodations, we must limit reservations to members of the congregation, the Men's Club and Sisterhood and their personal guests. These holiday celebrations are occasions when our entire congregational family comes together for an evening of sociability and good cheer. SABBATH CIRCLE TO BE RESUMED THIS SATURDAY

The Sabbath Circle which has become an established institution in our congregation will be resumed this Saturday afternoon in the chapel of the synagogue. The program for the afternoon will be as follows: At five o'clock. Mincha services will be conducted. Haskell Lookstein will officiate as Chazan and Fred Zuckerman will read the Torah. At 5:30 tea will be served in the Social Hall and Cantor Hyman Gertler will render several Zemiros selections. After that, Rabbi Lookstein will deliver the first in a series of lectures on "The Spiritual Heroes of Israel." The great personality that he will discuss will be Hillel, the outstanding rabbi and teacher of the first century. A ten minute question and answer period will follow. The Sabbath Circle will conclude with the Maariv service and Havdalah.

The Sabbath Circle is open to men and women, young and old. Westsiders who may wish to attend are cordially welcome. Arrangements for their transportation home after the service will be provided.
