REACTIONS TO BROTHERHOOD WEEK

Under the sponsorship of the National Conference of Christians and Jews there was observed during the period between Lincoln's and Washington's birthdays the traditional Brotherhood Week. It was attended by a great deal of fanfare. President Truman gave it official recognition. Movie stars spoke about it from the screens of movie houses all over the country. Jewish organizations, national and local in character, made awards to outstanding Christians who distinguished themselves in good-will work. Radio, Screen and Press combined to give unprecedented prominence to the cause of Brotherhood and good-will.

In the face of such irresistible public relations, the average American Jew or Christian may not have an opportunity to consider certain fundamental principles and issues involved in the matter.

Rabbi Lookstein has therefore chosen as his subject for this Saturday's sermon: "Brotherhood Week can be Hypocrisy unless——". This Sabbath is traditionally devoted to the reading from the Bible about the tyranny and bigotry of Amalek, the ancestor of Haman. It is fitting, therefore, to consider at this time the attempts made to obliterate bigotry which for the Jew takes on the guise of antisemitism.

We know that the Rabbi has some definite ideas on this subject which are not altogether in agreement with those commonly held by the proponents of the inter-faith movement. We may expect, therefore, a very brave and challenging sermon, and we advise you not to miss it.

PURIM IN OUR SYNAGOGUE

In accordance with tradition, Kehilath Jeshurun will celebrate the holiday of Purim in a gay and festive manner. The festival will be ushered in this Wednesday night, March 5th in the main synagogue, and will be inaugurated with the Maariv Services at 5:45 led by Cantor Hyman Gertler. Then will follow the reading of the Megillah accompanied by the traditional percussion instruments in the hands of our children.

Ramaz Boys to Read Megillah

This year we are introducing a new feature in our Purim service. Eight boys of the Ramaz School and High School will read the Megillah. They are: Norman Bernhardt, Jacob Bloom, George Gruen, Ari Icikovik, Haskel Lookstein, Mark Reis, Marvin Teichman and Freddie Zuckerman. This innovation has great educational value and is an excellent means of introducing our young men into the congregational family.

The program of entertainment will feature "Peter Pan the Magic Man" who will delight the youngsters with his bag of new and fascinating tricks. There will, of course, be music, songs and refreshments.

Purim Celebration, March 9th

On Sunday night, March 9th the Men's Club and Sisterhood will have a gala Purim party in the Synagogue House.

The party will begin at 6 o'clock with the serving of cocktails in the Social Hall. At 7 o'clock a buffet supper will be served in the auditorium. This will be followed by a splendid program of entertainment featuring Cantor Gertler and the Ramaz Chorus in a Purim operetta.

In addition, there will be community singing and the latest Palestine film in technicolor will be shown. In keeping with the spirit of the holiday, we have invited twenty disabled veterans from the local hospitals who will be our guests at this party.

Because of limited facilities, we must limit reservations to members of the congregation, the Men's Club and Sisterhood. Those who have not as yet sent in their reservations are urged to do so at once, since no reservations will be accepted after March 3rd.

Mr. Alex Garfein, chairman of the Purim Party and his able committee assure us a very enjoyable and delightful evening.
