Our annual collection for the Passover Relief Fund is now in progress. Concern for the needy at Passover time is one of the beautiful traditions of our people. The institution of **Maoth Chitim** or Money for Matzoths is timehonored and is described in the Jewish Codes of Law. A Jew cannot sit down at his Seder table to enjoy the Passover Festival unless he has previously arranged that those less fortunate than he shall have their Passover necessities.

The agency through which our congregation donates its help to the needy of our community is the Yorkville Passover Relief Fund. We are proud of the fact that our contribution is one of the largest towards that fund.


In addition, at Passover time, we give special stipends to needy individuals who would not otherwise come to the attention of public charity. Among them are a number of aged and infirm rabbis. In the last few years, we have also sent food packages to our brethren overseas. This year more than ever it is imperative that we continue that practice. Already we have received requests for these packages, as well as requests for help from families in Palestine who up to recently were Displaced Persons in the camps of Europe. To take care of the needy in our community, to provide special help for our suffering brethren in the D. P. camps, and to send even a modest contribution to Palestine, we shall require a minimum of \$3,000.00

We appeal, therefore, to all our congregants and friends to respond to the Passover Relief appeal, to be as generous as they can, and to be as prompt as possible in remitting their contributions. If assistance is to be rendered in time, then the funds must be made available immediately. Do not delay, and may God bless you for your kindness!
