RABBI FASCINATES AUDIENCE AT FIRST SUNDAY LECTURE

A representative group of men and women of the congregation, Men's Club and Sisterhood gathered in the Social Hall last Sunday night to inaugurate the series of Sunday Supper lectures sponsored by our Men's Club. It was an auspicious beginning and marked a new approach in the adult education efforts of the congregation. The atmosphere was informal and friendly—characteristic of a family get-together rather than of a lecture group.

The program of the evening proceeded according to schedule. At seven o'clock a buffet supper was served. This consisted of a delicious

four-course home-cooked meal prepared and served by our own men and women.

After supper and Grace the tables were cleared and the chairs arranged in lecture hall fashion. Mr. Ira F. Weisman, president of the Men's Club greeted the audience and introduced the Rabbi.

In his first lecture on the "Fore-runners of Political Zionism," Rabbi Lookstein dealt with the three aspects of pre-Herzlian Zionism—the political, cultural and religious. He portrayed the outstanding personalities representative of each of these aspects and discussed their contributions to Zionist ideology. Among them were: Moses Hess, Leon Pinsker, Ahad
