BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE TO BE PUBLISHED

For the past several years our congregation has published a Book of Remembrance in connection with its annual Yiskor Appeal. This book contains an appropriate prayer together with the names of the departed ones to be memorialized on the four occasions of the year when Yiskor is recited.

We should like to emphasize that this is by no means a fund-raising project. It is free of every aspect of commercialism. It is consistent with the Yiskor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. In order that such a pledge may be properly fulfilled, we give our congregants an opportunity to make a Yiskor offering prior to the Sha-

vuoth festival. The names in whose memory the offering is made are included in the Book of Remembrance which is placed in the hands of our worshippers during the memorial service.

In order to stress the purely religious character of the offering, it was decided that it be no less than five dollars and no more than ten dollars. Thus, the offering is purged of any material tinge and represents purely a token of reverance for the departed.

We are about to publish the 1947 Book of Remembrance and we know that all of our worshippers will want to have the names of their departed ones memorialized in that book. A special form for that purpose is now being prepared and will shortly be mailed to all our congregants and friends.
