

SUPPER LECTURES MOST SUCCESSFUL OVER 300 ATTEND SERIES

The fourth and last supper lecture on the subject, "Fifty Years of Zionist History," held last Sunday night was indeed a fitting climax to a most successful and enjoyable lecture series sponsored by our Men's Club. Over 300 men and women of the congregation and its affiliates attended these lectures. Seldom does one see such an eager and enthusiastic audience; seldom does one experience such genuine spirit of comradeship that prevailed at each of these lectures.

In his concluding lecture, Rabbi Lookstein spoke on, "Zionism in Palestine Since the Mandate." He discussed the Balfour Declaration, its interpretations and implications. He pointed out the great achievements of Dr. Chaim Weizmann and the part that he played in the political events that led up to the issuance of this historic document. The Rabbi minced no words in condemning the intrigues of the British Government and showed how its colonial policy violated both the letter and the spirit of the declaration.

In speaking of the future of Zionism, the Rabbi dramatically declared: "The Balfour Declaration came partly as a reward for the invention by Dr. Weizmann of an explosive that proved helpful in winning the First World War. That experience, however, released dormant hopes and energies in the heart of the Jew. The Jewish heart can no more be stilled. It will continue to beat fiercely and to pump forcefully these released energies through the body of collective Israel until the aspirations of 1800 years are realized—a Jewish state in Palestine."

At the conclusion of the series, the audience joined in the singing of "Hatikvah," thus bringing to a close an activity which was originally considered as an experiment but which turned out to be the most impressive and the most effective venture in adult education undertaken by our congregation.

MEN'S CLUB NEWS

Successful Forum Season Ends

A capacity audience of men and women attended the last Men's Club Forum Meeting of the season held Tuesday, April 15th in the auditorium of the Synagogue House. The guest speaker was the outstanding economist, Dr. Isador Lubin, former director of the Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics who delivered a stimulating address on the subject, "Russia in the World Picture.'

Before introducing the speaker of the evening, Mr. Ira F. Weisman, President of the Men's Club greeted the audience and gave a brief resume of the season's activities of the organization. He then presented two checks, each in the amount of \$500 to the Scholarship Funds of the Ramaz School and the Afternoon Religious School. Mr. Saul J. Lance, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Ramaz and Mr. Abbott Bernard, Chairman of the Religious School Committee acknowledged the gifts and thanked the Men's Club for its splendid cooperation. Mr. Weisman pointed out that this contribu was but one of the many benevolences extended by the Men's Club to the educational and philanthropic institutions in the community.

Dr. Lubin, the guest speaker, who was enthusiastically welcomed by the audience told of his experiences as a representative on the Allied Reparations Commission to Moscow. Having observed first-hand the political and social conditions in Russia, he was able to describe and evaluate the attitude of the man in the street as well as of the government official in Russia towards the United States. "We can hope to establish permanent world peace," Dr. Lubin added, "only if we have a full understanding of Russia's problems and needs.'

At the close of the meeting, a collation was served in the Social Hall.
