JUDGE SHIENTAG HONORED BY COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY

Our very esteemed member, Judge Bernard L. Shientag was honored last Tuesday, June 3rd, at the commencement exercises of Columbia University. The honorary degree of Doctor of Laws was conferred upon him. The citation which accompanied the award reads as follows:

BERNARD LLOYD SHIENTAG — Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of New York; a native New Yorker who from the very beginning of an honorable career has served city and State as jurist and as citizen; a member of the bar who during the intervals of busy court years has performed the duties of chairman of commissions of humanitarian intent; whose counsel has been sought in nearly every aspect of the welfare of the state; whose "judge's viewpoint" on matters of Trial practice and procedure received country-wide approbation from the legal profession; whose own aspiration is to make the law the "continuing and progressive instrument of liberty of truth and of justice."

Kehilath Jeshurun is proud of the high honor that has been bestowed upon one of its distinguished sons. We extend our congratulations to Judge Shientag and to his family.

MEN'S CLUB NEWS IRA F. WEISMAN RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT

The Eighth Annual Business Meeting of the Men's Club, held last Tuesday, June 3rd, in the auditorium of the Synagogue House brought to a close the most active and the most successful season in the history of the organization. It was a season marked by a record membership, splendid social and cultural achievements and outstanding benevolences.

The progress of the organization was reflected in the reports of the year's activities given by the chairmen of the standing committees. Mr. William B. Fischberg, Treasurer, submitted a statement on the finances of the Men's Club. The membership report which was to have been given by the late Jacob H. Following the business part of the meeting Rabbi Lockstein delivered

an enlightening address on the timely topic, "The Anglo-American Approach to the Palestine Problem," with special reference to the two recent books on the subject, "Behind the Silken Curtain," by Bartley C. Crum, and "Palestine Mission," by Richard H. S. Crossman. The Rabbi's presentation evoked a lively discussion in which many members participated.

After the meeting the usual collation was served in the Social Hall, thus bringing to a conclusion a fruitful, successful and most enjoyable season.
