

NEW SYNAGOGUE FRONT SOON TO BE READY

ALTERATION PROJECT PROCEEDING RAPIDLY

The alteration of the Synagogue structure which began early in July is making noticeable progress. Within a few weeks it is expected that the new front of the synagogue will be completed. Work will then continue on the lower floor of the synagogue where the plans call for a new chapel for daily services, a dining hall to seat 250 people with all catering facilities, lounges and check rooms, and a synagogue library which will also serve as the Board of Trustees meeting room. Two marble and bronze stair cases will lead from the lower floor to the Main Synagogue. Included in this unit of the work is an elevator which will serve the Synagogue as well as the Synagogue House.

After the lower floor is completed work will begin in the Main Synagogue which will be completely remodeled and redecorated. According to Lustbader Company, the builders, the entire alteration job should be completed by the end of the year.

The membership of the congregation will be pleased to learn that during the entire summer the Building Alterations Committee held sessions and met with the architect and builder to discuss all matters pertaining to the alterations.

During the course of the alterations and especially during the High Holiday Season our worshipers may not be able to enjoy all of the comforts and conveniences to which they have become accustomed during the years. We appeal to their sympathetic understanding and ask them to bear with us remembering all the while that in the end they will be able to enjoy a place of worship that will be a delight to the eye and an inspiration to the soul.

SYNAGOGUE ORDINANCES

Many worshippers will be with us for the first time these High Holy Days. For their benefit, as well as for the benefit of our regular worshippers, we make known the following ordinances:

(1) Admission to the services during the High Holy Days will be by card only. This rule will be strictly enforced.

(2) We do not expect to have any vacant seats during the holidays. We, therefore, ask our worshippers not to bring children to the Synagogue unless seats have been reserved for them. To do otherwise will crowd and inconvenience those who have a right to their seats.

(3) The doors are closed during the sermon. Please, therefore, be in your seat before the sermon begins.

(4) Please join in the congregational singing.

(5) Conversation of any kind is forbidden during the services. Proper decorum is essential for dignified worship.

(6) Please do not remove the Talith or leave your seat until after the benediction is pronounced at the close of the services.

The Synagogue ushers do their job voluntarily and devotedly. Please cooperate with them by respecting their wishes.

are with us for the first time, is indeed an outstanding one. All of them licensed and fully-qualified, there are among their number teachers connected with the public school system, Ramaz, and other institutions where the calibre of instruction is beyond reproach. Our parents may well rest assured that their children will receive their Hebrew training at the hands of a faculty which ranks with that of the finest afternoon school in the city.

In view of the holiday schedule throughout this month, there will be no Sunday sessions until Sunday, October 12th. The Junior Congregation, which was so well attended last year, will continue its weekly serv-

ices on Saturday, October 11th, and it is expected that the children will participate as they have in the past.

Although our classes are limited in the number of pupils to be admitted, there are still some vacancies in some of the classes. Parents are urged to register their children without delay, since regular week-day sessions will be conducted during the holiday period, and children are being taught their regular subjects during this time. A day lost will be hard to regain, and every day adds a good deal to the education of young children.

The office is open daily for the registration of new children, and Mr. Rosenblum, our Principal, will be glad to assist in any problem concerning the Hebrew education of your child.
