THE HOLIDAY SEASON — IN RETROSPECT

It is really a source of pleasure to view in retrospect the season of festivals which we just celebrated. From the first Rosh Hashanah service to the very end of the Simchat Torah service, Kehilath Jeshurun worshipers are unanimous in their praise of the manner in which the holidays were commemorated.

In spite of the alterations now in progress in the Synagogue structure, the High Holiday services were conducted in a most decorous and inspiring fashion. The beautiful renditions of Cantor Gertler and Mr. Adler, the scholarly and enlightening sermons of the Rabbi, and the participation of the entire congregation blended to-

gether in one, to make these services memorable for their impressiveness and dignity.

Succoth—

The Succoth services were conducted in the Auditorium of the Synagogue House because of the work now being done in the Synagogue. While we had to forego the pleasure of a large Succah, we nevertheless were able to have a Succah for our worshipers which served adequately for Kiddush and for the proper celebration of the Holiday.

The Simchat Torah service was as beautiful as ever, despite the limited capacity of the Auditorium. As in the
