CLASSES IN ADULT INSTITUTE NOW BEING ORGANIZED

Classes in the Kehilath Jeshurun Institute for Jewish Studies are now being formed for the coming year. Inspired by the success of the Institute during the past year, we are planning to expand the curriculum to include courses never before offered, and enlarge the scope of the Institute in keeping with the demand.

As in the past year, classes are being organized in Hebrew—Elemen-

tary, Intermediate and Advanced; Elementary and Advanced Yiddish; Bible; History; Hebrew Songs and Melodies; and Jewish Laws and Customs. In addition, courses in Cantillations (Haftorah reading), conducted by Mr. Joseph Adler, are being scheduled for those of our members and friends who wish to participate

more actively in the synagogue service.

Meeting once a week, our classes are limited in number to permit of the maximum individual expression and attention. The faculty of the Institute consists of highly qualified, well-trained teachers who are experts in the field of Jewish education. Some of them are on the teaching staff of the Ramaz School and of our afternoon Religious School.

The Institute, founded a year ago, was most enthusiastically received by our members and friends. The response as manifested by actual registrations for the courses offered, exceeded considerably the hopes of the most optimistic observers.

The progress of the courses was another source of great satisfaction. To the man, those who attended these classes were unanimous in their

praise of the manner in which the Institute was conducted. We have already received innumerable requests for information about the resumption of classes for the coming year, an excellent indication of the regard our students hold for the Institute.

Registration for all courses is now in progress. We are enclosing a registration form which we ask those who are interested to return to us as soon as possible. The days on which classes will be scheduled, will be adapted to the convenience of the majority. We therefore suggest that you lose no time in registering for one or more courses. Sessions begin the week of October 27th.

We believe our members and friends should take advantage of this opportunity. It is never too late where an education is concerned, and it is our feeling that the Kehilath Jeshurun Institute for Jewish Studies offers an excellent medium for cultural enrichment.
