school (also known as a Yeshiva) and its history in Europe, the continent of its birth, and in America. The Rabbi then describes the set-ups of the various types of all-day schools: the traditional Yeshiva, the modern Yeshiva, the Integrated Yeshiva (of which Ramaz is the oldest) and the Hebrew-English School. The aims, methods and curriculum of each are described briefly in a most lucid and interesting manner.

The Rabbi concludes his article with two predictions: the Jewish allday school will contribute greatly to the enrichment and advancement of Jewish learning in America; secondly, it is destined to become a major contribution of American Israel to American cultural democracy.
