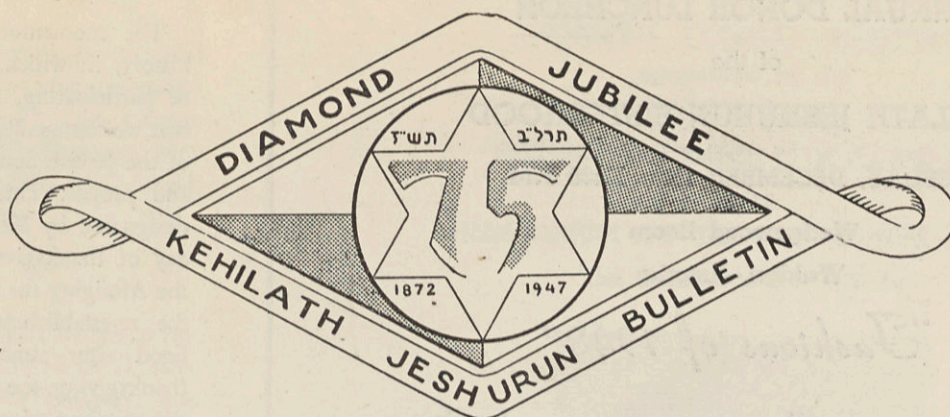


Salute the Jewish State- Attend Services This Saturday!

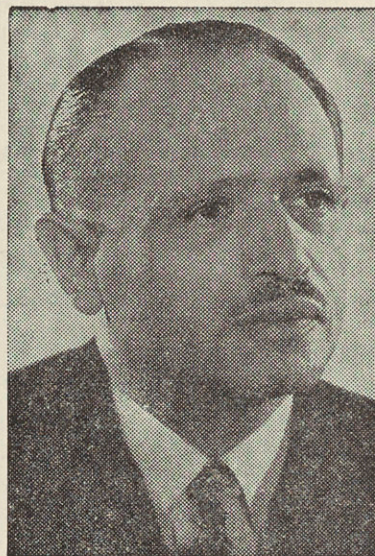

As its guest speaker the evening of December 16th, the Men's Club has invited Rabbi C. L. Heilpern, fearless and outspoken critic of British policies in the Cyprus Camps. Known throughout the length and breadth of Great Britain, Rabbi Heilpern represented its Chief Rabbi's Council at the Cyprus Camps for six months, during which time he was highly instrumental in the amelioration of the conditions of those Jews headed for Haifa who were thwarted in their efforts and interned in Cyprus.

Rabbi Heilpern was in close contact with the Palestine government, in close touch with its population, and widely acclaimed for his efforts on behalf of the

internees at these camps, having been their confidant and counsellor and fully acquainted with their trials. Not only, then, will we hear the real facts, but we will be given the human side of the story—living, colorful and unforgettable scenes of what he has seen and experienced.

We assure our guests of a most interesting and enjoyable evening—one which will remain with them for a long time to come. We know our friends will want to hear Rabbi Heilpern, and we cordially invite them—men and women—to attend this Forum Meeting.
