We have received the following telegram this week:

HAVE RECEIVED AUTHORITATIVE INFORMATION OF EXTREMELY GRAVE SITUATION IN PALESTINE STOP MUST MOBILIZE CONGREGATIONS AND INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS TO WIRE THE PRESIDENT STATE DEPARTMENT AND SENATORS URGING THAT AMERICAN GOVERNMENT TAKE INITIATIVE IN HELPING UN COMMISSION IMPLEMENT PALESTINE RESOLUTION BY CREATING INTERNATIONAL FORCE STOP ALSO TO SUPPLY ARMS TO ENABLE PALESTINE JEWS TO DEFEND THEMSELVES AND UPHOLD UN DECISION STOP OUR BRETHREN WAGING DESPERATE FIGHT AGAINST RUTHLESS ENEMIES STOP THEIR FATE AND FATE OF UN DECISION DEPENDS ON AMERICA STOP YOUR IMMEDIATE ACTION IMPERATIVE.

The urgency of the situation is apparent from the tone and language of the wire. It is a matter which vitally concerns every Jew and every American.

YESHIVA UNIVERSITY TO HONOR MEMORY OF HARRY FISCHEL

In appropriate ceremonies to be conducted this Sunday, February 1st at 3:30, Yeshiva University will pay tribute to the memory of Harry Fischel, one of its outstanding workers and benefactors whose recent passing in Palestine came as a severe blow to world Jewry. The services will be conducted in the Harry Fischel Synagogue of the Yeshiva, which was so named years ago as a fitting gesture to the man who was one of its founders, and chairman of its building committee.

Yehuda Hellman to Speak at Forum Meeting—

As the guest speaker at its next Forum Meeting, to be held Tuesday, February 17th, the Men's Club has invited a young Palestinian journalist, Yehuda Hellman. Mr. Hellman will speak on "What Next in Palestine?"

Mr. Hellman, an expert on Arab affairs, is on a short lecture tour of the United States. He comes to us well qualified to depict and explain the plight of world Jewry and the dynamics of the Palestinian Jewish community. As a correspondent of the "Palestine Post," Mr. Hellman made international headlines when he was arrested in Lebanon during his tour of journalistic duty with the Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry in 1946. An entire chapter is devoted to the exploits of Mr. Hellman by Bartley C. Crum, a member of that Committee, in his book "Behind the Silken Curtain."

The speaker is a graduate of Palestinian schools including the Hebrew University, and received a degree in political science from the American University at Beirut. At present he is on the staff of one of the Hebrew dailies of Palestine.

To members of Kehilath Jeshurun, the name of Harry Fischel was very well known. He was one of its most distinguished members, the Gabbai of the Mishna Class for many years. He retained his position of Trustee, then Honorary Trustee, to the very end, and we are proud to have been able to number him among us.

We extend an invitation to our members and friends to participate in the Memorial Service this Sunday at Yeshiva University. We should all join in paying tribute to the memory of one who will always remain in our hearts for the great deeds he performed on this earth.
