MEN'S CLUB NEWS

As guest lecturer at its next Forum Meeting, to be held on Tuesday, March 16th, the Men's Club has invited Capt. Harry N. Sperber, Chief German interpreter at the Nuremberg Trials, who has just returned from Europe. Capt. Sperber will speak on "Peace—Can the U. N. Hold It?", a topic of importance and timeliness, which he is well-qualified to discuss for us.

A native of Germany, Capt. Sperber was a journalist and broadcaster who soon found himself on the Gestapo blacklist. His knowledge of Europe as well as his linguistic abilities, prompted his appointment into the Military Intelligence Branch of the U. S. Army, and, posing as a German, he roamed the beer halls, railroad stations and other gathering places of Germany, and listened to plans and hopes for the future never before revealed to America.

As Chief German Interpreter at the Nuremberg Trials, he came into close contact with such war leaders as Goering, Von Ribbentrop, Von Papen, and others who were subsequently released, and who are currently active in sabotaging U. N. efforts at world peace. His experiences abroad in many of the European countries, renders him qualified to discuss, from an expert's viewpoint, the world situation today.

The Men's Club Forum Meeting platform has been graced with many outstanding speakers this year. We dare say that Captain Sperber will take his place among the most outstanding of this season or any other.

We invite you and your friends—including the ladies—to be present March 16th. An enjoyable and informative evening is in store for you. The meeting will begin promptly at 8:30 p.m.
