MEN'S CLUB NEWS

Large Audience Hears Capt. Sperber—

A large audience was in attendance at the Forum Meeting of Tuesday evening, and heard Capt. Harry N. Sperber speak on the general world situation as seen through the eyes of one who has spent years living in Germany and with the German mind. Deviating somewhat from his original topic, the speaker painted a vivid picture of German mentality, starting with the Nazi leaders in whose trial at Nuremberg Capt. Sperber participated; and coming down to the effects on the young American occupation troops which the German environment has produced.

Pointing to the policy which America is following in its dealing with post-war Germany, Capt. Sperber decried the indifference and complacency of Americans — an attitude which he termed "suicidal". An aroused American populace can do much to forestall the resurgence of fascism and nazism, which is so ingrained in the minds of the German people even today.

Capt. Sperber was received very warmly, and, rounded out by the usual refreshments, the audience spent a most enjoyable evening.

April 13th Date of Next Forum Meeting—

The next Forum Meeting will take place on Tuesday, April 13th, at which time we will hear Alvin Rosenfeld, writer for the New York Post. His topic has not as yet been announced, but we urge you to set the date aside and plan to be with us.

CONSERVATISM DISCUSSED AT SECOND SUPPER LECTURE

At the second of the current Supper-Lecture series, held last Sunday, Rabbi Lookstein spoke before a filled meeting room on Conservative Judaism. Like the lecture of a week ago, the talk was most enthusiastically received and evoked a number of questions which showed signs of deep and serious thinking on the subject.

The Rabbi traced the history of the Conservative movement, dwelling on the sources for the movement which were given by one of its outstanding leaders in a book on the background of this facet of Judaism. Rabbi Lookstein spoke of the wide variance among outstanding Conservative congregations in the conduct of services. observance of rituals and ceremonies and in synagogue practices. He also analyzed briefly the composition of the Conservative rabbinate and the constitution of a Conservative seminary as compared to one of the Orthodox or Reform branches of our religion.

In all, the Rabbi's talk showed a keen understanding of Conservatism and a profound knowledge of those factors which, according to its exponents, constitute Conservative Judaism.

Since the entire lecture was devoted to Conservatism, a slight change in the remaining lectures will take place. On April 4th, at the third in the series, the Rabbi will talk on "Reconstructionist Judaism"; and in the final lecture on April 11th, Orthodox Judaism will be discussed, as well as the future of religion in American Israel.
