

# KEHILATH JESHURUN PROVIDES FOR THE NEEDY AT PASSOVER TIME

A long-standing tradition in Israel is to provide for those in need at Passover time. The Talmud and the Codes of Law speak of this tradition. Every Jewish community the world over makes available a fund out of which are purchased Matzoth and other Passover necessities for distribution among the poor.

upon to raise large sums at Passover time and always we came through. This year we require a minimum of \$3,000. How will that sum be spent? To begin with, a very large part of it will go to the Yorkville Passover Relief Committee which takes care of the poor and needy in our immediate neighbourhood. A substantial sum will go as special Passover grants to deserving institutions here and abroad. Out of this fund, too, will be taken care of respectable and deserving families about whose needs we know and who would normally not come to the attention of public charity.

This year we are anxious to send a substantial contribution to our beleaguered brethren in the holy city of Jerusalem. Thousands of Jews in that city have been cut off from the normal

Mr. Rosenfeld, on the staff of the New York Post, is a well-known reporter with a knack for being where news is breaking. During a recent trip to Palestine, for example, he spent 24 hours in a beleagueredHaganah headquarters in Jerusalem, a witness to British confiscation of Jewish arms; the burning of homes and offices; the stoning of buses.

Mr. Rosenfeld was the only correspondent to make the DP camps-to-New York trip with the first group of refugees to enter America under the Truman immigration directive; his account of this historic journey won honorable mention in a journalistic contest.

His assignments have included coverage of UNRRA and UN meetings, labor, political and industrial stories; but his knowledge of Pales-
