#### KINDERGARTEN GROUP OPENS

A new group has been added to the Religious School roster of classes—a Kindergarten for children between the ages of four and six. The group meets Sunday mornings, from 10:00 to noon, and is supervised by a young, qualified Kindergartner, Miss Helen Lesser.

The program is the same that is found in the better Kindergartens, with the exception that material of Jewish content is emphasized. Activities center around Jewish ceremonial objects, Jewish customs, life in Israel, and Jewish holidays and festivals. Common objects that the child is likely to encounter are referred to by their Hebrew names, so that from the earliest age, the child is introduced to Hebrew culture.

We know that our readers will be happy to learn of the opening of this group and that they will register their children without any loss of time. Mr. Appleman, the Principal of the Religious School, will be happy to give further information to interested parents.

## JUNIOR CONGREGATION SERVICES RESUME

Sabbath morning services for the young ones in our Kehilath Jeshurun family were resumed last Saturday. Under the watchful eye of Mr. Paul Orentlicher, a graduate of Yeshiva University and currently teaching in the College of the City of New York, the Junior Congregation is conducted wholly by the children who attend. The Cantor, the Reader of the Torah, and all participants in the service are chosen from among the members of the Junior Congregation.

The services are held in the Chapel, on the entrance level of the Synagogue building, start at 10:00 o'clock in the morning and last for about one and a half hours. A "kiddush" is served at the close of the service, provided by the Parents' Club.

Parents are urged to send their children to these services. The benefits that accrue from regular attendance cannot fully be described. Here is an opportunity for children to learn at first hand how the Sabbath services are conducted, and to participate in that service. Not only does the service become more meaningful, but the training that the children receive at the hands of their Hebrew teachers is translated into action — something that will remain with them for all time.

He brings to the platform a rich and varied background and experience in Jewish affairs as well.
